Dear NRHS German Students and Parents,

I'm excited to invite NRHS German 3 and German 4 students on a field trip to URI for URI: German/STEM Career Day. This field trip takes place from Thursday November 1, 2018 through Saturday November 3, 2018.

On Friday morning, students will partake in the Career Booster: Germany. This event is organized by the Goethe-Institut Boston, and showcases excellent opportunities for German speakers in Germany as well as in the U.S. Representatives from German universities, foundations, exchange organizations, companies and the German Consulate will present career options and show how students can succeed with German. Participating students will explore options for career paths, professional training, German university degree programs (without tuition fees), scholarships, and apprenticeships in Germany and in the USA. This event takes place at the Cambria Hotel in Newport, RI.

On Saturday, students will partake in a German-STEM-Immersion Day. In a German – immersion setting, students will work on hands-on STEM-experiments with other speaking high school students, university students and URI faculty. The STEM immersion day is supported in part by alumni and current ambassadors of the German International Engineering Program (IEP) at URI. A highlight of the day will be the workshop “No fear of science!” by German science entertainer and author Jo(achim) Hecker. This event takes place at the University of Rhode Island in Kingston, RI.

The total cost for students is between \$75 and \$100. Lodging for students, based on two nights and four students per room, is \$50.00 p.p. The first night we will [Atlantic Beach Hotel & Suites](#), 34 Wave Ave, Middletown, RI 02842. The second night we will stay at Holiday Inn, 3009 Tower Hill Road, South Kingstown, Rhode Island 02874. Transportation costs are dependent on the number of students who participate, and are estimated between \$25.00- \$50.00. (The more students who go, the less expensive the bus is.) Food is provided for on Friday and Saturday, students should bring something to eat on Thursday, or money to purchase food. Scholarships are available if the cost is prohibitive.

Lastly, I'm looking for chaperone(s) to accompany us on this field trip. If you are interested, even if only for part of the trip, please let me know.
