

The top three things the space hinders:

Quality of teaching and learning space

- Technology use is limited due to coverage
- Size of spaces don't align with demand
- Space isn't configured efficiently to aide education
 - Science labs aren't twenty-first century

Quantity of space

- Number of teachers traveling limits communication and collaboration with their kids due to travel
- Wall displays can't travel
- Constrains schedule options
- Collaboration space
- Cafeteria is too small; impacts master schedule forcing four lunches (20 minutes each)
- Small student meeting space
- Limited number of offices for confidential meetings/sessions with students
- Limited conference room space

Limited Programs

- Music program has only two practice rooms
- Art rooms are too small and not appropriately set up for art
- Science labs aren't twenty-first century
- Industrial Arts space is still 1960's equipment and program
- No small media space for video for small/medium groups
- No theatre space for instruction
- Computer Science courses can't be taught because of limited lab access
- No fitness, dance, movement, yoga space
- Limited Consumer Science and Foods space
- Child Development Program Access
